SCC Cllr Mike Rigby gave his report.

- The School is under the County Council's Schools Improvement intervention team and is getting the support and resources it needs to get the school back on track.
- Covid Numbers are still high although all restrictions have now been lifted.
- The Energy Grant of £150 will be paid direct to Council Tax payers who pay by Direct Debit on band A-D properties automatically. For all other methods of payment, the grant will need to be applied for. An extra fund is available to those that fall outside of the main criteria, so they can apply from this grant funding.
- Broadband update has been given, working on local areas with Airband.
- Tonedale Mill has a compulsory repair order on it, and SCC are working on these repairs.
- Firepool is moving forward and if planning is approved works should start in April.

#### 22/22 Casual Vacancy, Co-option

No one has come forward from the appeal in the Parish Newsletter. With the Election coming up all Cllrs would now be up for re-election in May, so there is no requirement for a co-option at this time.

#### 22/23 Parish Council Election 5<sup>th</sup> May

The Parish Council and County Council Elections are coming up on 5<sup>th</sup> May. All Parish Councillors have been given nomination packs, and if anyone else would like one they can be gained from Clerk or the Electoral Services Returning Officer at SWT. Nominations must be delivered by 4pm on 5<sup>th</sup> April to the Returning Officer at either West Somerset House, Williton or The Deane House, Taunton. If any election is contested the poll will take place on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2022 for the Parish Council.

County Councill Elections will also take place on this date for the new County Councillors for a yea; these Cllrs will then become the new Unitary Council Councillors.

Notices will be placed on the Notice boards and on the website.

## 22/24 Fingerpost repairs

Cllr Marshall has been working at restoring the fingerposts in the Parish, the painting of some has been completed although some now need cleaning. Cllr Marshall has found that 4 posts and fingers need repair rather than painting. He has spoken with Quantock Landscape Partnership Scheme who are able to give a 75% grant of the costs of repairs. Cllrs agreed to look into the costs and grant further.

The 4 posts are at Lower Tarr, Tarr Road and Tolland Road Cross, Deane's Cross, and Rexton Lane Cross. It was also reported that the one at Common Down, Chapel Leigh is bent, so this too may need repairing.

# Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland Parish Council

As you are probably aware there is due to be a significant Local Government reorganisation in the near future. The five former District Councils will be merged into one unitary authority as well as other changes which affect all other councils throughout the county.

As a result of the reorganisation, elections for the new unitary Somerset Council as well as to the City, Town and Parish councils across Somerset will be brought forward from 2023, to take place on 5th May 2022. This is to ensure all local elections in Somerset remain aligned.

At these elections on 5th May, City, Town and Parish councillors will be elected for a term of five years instead of the usual four-year term. This does mean that members elected in 2019 will have been in post for only three years at the next election.

What does all this mean for us? Well, our Parish Council is divided into two Wards – Lydeard St Lawrence Ward, which returns seven Councillors, and Tolland Ward, which returns two, and we will need people who are willing to fill those positions.

The Parish Council is the first level of Local Government, playing an important role in the local community, including reviewing local planning applications and distributing government and other funding in ways that benefit the local community. This year one of the first things on the agenda is organising an event for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations in June.

To be able to best carry out its function effectively it needs a full quota of members. The duties are not onerous - the Council meets 8 or 9 times a year - and is a very valuable way of serving the community in which we live.

If you would like to stand for either Ward you will need to complete a Parish and Town Council Nomination form, which can be obtained from our Parish Clerk Lorna Thorne (2 Beech Tree Close, Wiveliscombe TA4 2PE; e-mail lornathorne-lsltpc@hotmail.com) or from the Returning Officer, West Somerset House, Killick Way, Williton TA4 4QA.

Nomination forms must be delivered to the Returning Officer at either West Somerset House or at The Deane Hose, Belvedere Road, Taunton TA1 1HE no later than 5th April.

#### BETTER BUS CHARTER FOR SOMERSET

We need to do something about improving our buses in Somerset. Our county currently has the second lowest level of bus journeys per resident of all the counties in England and Somerset's bus services have the very lowest level of passenger satisfaction in the country.

Residents of Somerset experience this every day, whether it's with difficulties getting to health services, reduced opportunities for those seeking work and further education or just the limited (if any) evening and Sunday bus services. As a result, we see ever increasing numbers of cars on our roads which causes higher levels of local air pollution and increase our carbon emissions.

Somerset Bus Partnership was formed just a year ago to campaign for better bus services across our county and already we have a Somerset-wide network of 115 town and parish transport representatives who share our passion for better buses.

Somerset residents have every right to expect better, but it will need funding.

#### THE SOMERSET BUS CHARTER

#### BETTER BUSES FOR ALL OUR COMMUNITIES

We need a core network of frequent, high-quality services linking our towns and main villages with enhanced weekend and evening services. Also we want an extension of the demand-responsive 'Slinky' bus services, available to all and with longer operating hours.

#### AN INTEGRATED TRANSPORT NETWORK

We need bus routes to link with local railway stations with timetables that offer improved connections between buses and trains.

We also want to see the introduction of integrated ticketing across the county's different bus operators and with trains too.

#### PROMOTION OF EXISTING AND NEW SERVICES

We should be promoting the bus as an important way by which we all can address the climate emergency in Somerset (transport accounts for nearly half of all carbon emissions in Somerset).

To enable more to go by bus, it is essential that current bus timetable information is shown at all main bus stops and bus times information is available in libraries and at other information points.

#### AN AFFORDABLE TRANSPORT SERVICE FOR ALL

We should make bus travel more attractive through cheaper fares especially targeted at young people up to the age of 25. Plus, for everyone, a new, all-operator, countywide value ticket.

#### **CLEANER BUSES**

We want an accelerated transition from diesel buses to zero emission buses.

#### MEANINGFUL FUNDING OF BUS SERVICES

We need Somerset's bus budget to be brought progressively up to the average for similar rural authorities in the South West.
