Minutes of the Meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> July 2018 at 7.30pm in Lydeard St Lawrence Village Hall.

Councillors present, Jonathan Marshall (Chairman), Deborah Telling (Vice Chair), Charles Cox, Don Hobson, Matt Hele, Mary Harding, Edward White and Maeve Vickery

Also in attendance: Borough Councillor Gwil Wren, County Councillor Mike Rigby, Lorna Thorne, Parish Clerk, and Andrew Venner.

- 18/50 **Apologies** from PCSO Louise Fyne.
- 18/51 **Declarations of interest** None received
- 18/52 The **Minutes** of the meeting held on 21<sup>st</sup> May 2018 were agreed and signed as an accurate record.

### 18/53 Matters Arising

### 53.1 **Lydeard St Lawrence Parish Playground Project** - update (18/43.2,17/102.1)

Cllr Hele reported that he is still waiting for a 3<sup>rd</sup> quote. He has interest from the new Headmaster at the Primary School, Chris Rutland, and is hoping that he is happy to work with the project. The Cricket Club have requested some equipment that can be in place quickly such as football goals etc. A formal request for this will be put together for the next meeting. The cricket club have a new safety report which Cllr Hele will look at in more detail.

### 53.2 Village Defibrillator in Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland (18/44.4,17/71)

Cllr Marshall has spoken with the Cricket Club Chairman, who is going to speak to the rest of the club.

### 18/54 Parish Council Vacancy - Co-option

Cllr Hobson proposed Andrew Venner to be co-opted onto the Parish Council as he lives in the Village, this was seconded by Cllr Hele and agreed *nem. con*.

Andrew Venner signed the Declaration of Acceptance. The Chairman then welcomed Mr Venner onto the Council.

### 18/55 Planning

### 55.1 Applications received for comment from Taunton Deane BC:

22/18/0011 Erection of replacement porch on the front elevation and expose original stonework on east gable end at 4 Victoria Terrace, Lydeard St Lawrence.

Cllrs agreed to support this application.

22/18/0010 Creation of water run off collection pit and landscape bund on land at Nethercott Lane, Lydeard St Lawrence. (retention of works already undertaken)

The Planning Committee have concerns over this, with further development continuing to add to the damaged state of Nethercott Lane. Also concerns were raised over the risk of overflow and erosion of the lining of the pit.

### 55.2 Notification of any Taunton Deane Decisions:

None Received

### 18/56 Financial

56.1 The Accounts Statement had been noted by the Council.

56.2 To Pay Clerks Salary and Expenses of £414.60

Proposed Cllr Hobson, Seconded Cllr Vickery.

Agreed unanimously.

### 18/57 **Speeding through Tolland Village**

An issue with excessive speeding has been raised through the Village of Tolland. The speed limit in the Village is national speed limit (60 mph), so what we are looking at is probably more a case of careless or dangerous driving. It is probably not possible for the speed limit to be reduced as the housing is not dense enough for it to introduced. Cllrs agreed to place a notice in the newsletter and any complaints of dangerous driving should be reported to the PCSO.

### 18/58 Electoral Review of Somerset West and Taunton: Draft Recommendations

Cllrs agreed that the new group proposed for Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland were with similar villages and should work well together; the new area would have two councillors. The Cllrs felt a comment at this stage is not required.

### 18/59 Correspondence and items for information

Crime Report

Lend a Hand – Fingerposts – Cllr Marshall has had an interest from a couple of residents who are going to do the training in order to help him with the local fingerposts restoration.

### **Any other Business**

County Councillor Mike Rigby spoke to the Council.

- He is concerned over the financial position of Somerset County Council and the Local Councils in Somerset. It is felt that a Unitary Council could be formed for the whole of Somerset, this would help save money and be better for customer services.
- Fair funding has been requested in the Council, but cuts will still be made with the subsidised buses ending next year. Adult Social Care is also affected by lack of funding.
- Two small improvements schemes have been approved. A footpath along the A358 in Norton Fitzwarren and a junction improvement at the Farmers Arms, Combe Florey. The Voucher scheme is still available for residents in slow Broadband areas.

### Borough Councillor **Gwil Wren** then spoke to the Council.

- He also spoke about the unitary Council and how the number of Councillors will reduce significantly.
- The Somerset West and Taunton Council now have a shadow authority and will help the transition and making the new Council able to run from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019. The restructuring of staff has begun with the Planning Department most affected by retirement and officers stepping down.
- The new warding patterns will affect Cllr Wren's area and will most likely see Lydeard St Lawrence with a new Borough Councillor. He reminded the Parish Council of the Elections next May.
- Cllr Harding requested information regarding the erection of an aeroplane hangar at a farm in Tolland. Planning permission has not been sought and the owners have been told to apply for retrospective planning permission from TDBC.
- Cllr Harding also asked if the Tolland Village signs could be repainted as they are looking tired. Cllr Marshall will investigate this possibility. New signs could cost £300 and maybe an alternative option would be to replace them.
- Reports of a drone hovering over Westleigh have been received. This will be monitored and if continues reported to the PCSO.
- The phone box in Lydeard St Lawrence has now finally been removed.
- The Book Exchange in Tolland now has some flower planters thanks to the Tolland Fund.
- Cllr Hele has been in talks with the Primary School Headmaster Chris Rutland who is keen to work with the village in the Remembrance Centenary celebrations. Maureen Young has taken the lead on this and is co-ordinating all organisations within the village.
- Cllr Cox raised an issue with building works happening at Hoccombe Farm. This will be reported to TDBC Planning Enforcement.
- Paul Yeomans is hopeful that the works on the Church path can start next week once the school breaks up for the holidays. The contractors are able to keep the footpath open as people will still be able to use the small side gate.

The next meeting will be on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2018 at 7.30pm

### Lydeard St Lawrence Church Development Project August 2018

The resurfacing work on the church path between the main gate and the war memorial has been completed in good time by our contractor, JY Coles of Taunton. The cost of the work will be shared between the Parish Council and the Parochial Church Council. This is great news and good progress towards our preparations for the Armistice Centenary event in November.

The architect has completed the survey work and created some plans and drawings showing possible changes to the church. These include the provision of a toilet and a servery, the creation of more space at the front and back of the church and changes needed to use the south porch as the main entrance. The plans will be on display at the Church Fete on 11 August and at other events during the autumn. This presents an opportunity to comment on the proposals and to express how you would like to see the church develop as a community asset in the next few years. This essential preparatory work is possible through the grant provided by the Big Lottery fund - so thank you to all National Lottery players.



### **Lydeard St Lawrence Cricket**

This month's report starts with the match against Taunton on 30<sup>th</sup> June on one of the hottest days this year. The match started with Taunton's skipper saying a few chosen words for one of their players, Tom, who just died aged only 27. LSL went on to score 253 for 6 with Mark Hannaford top scoring with a very creditable 129 on a fast outfield. Our bowlers kept on plugging away and wickets tumbled but their skipper held firm eventually scoring his century and with tense finish in sight, Taunton made the winning run in the last over with only 2 wickets to spare. Close but no cigar.

The next match coincided with the England/Sweden game in the world cup and LSL were asked to see if a morning match was possible, but this was not possible as some our players work on Saturday morning. Timberscombe then declared that they were unable to raise a team, so all 26 points came to us, but unfortunately there was no match to report.

On the 14th July LSL were away at Dulverton and we batted first and made 217 for 8 with Tom Bennett scoring 48, Ed White 46 and man of the match Ben Meek scoring 63 and then taking 8 for 21 as Dulverton were skittled out for just 80 giving us another full scalp of 26 points.

The following week saw us play Bagborough at home. A clash of the Titans as first took on second for a power play game of cricket. LSL set the bar high with a great batting total of 239 for 6 with Mark (back in the runs) Hannaford scoring a splendid 84 and Tom Meek adding a further 48 runs. Bagborough, however, proved that as likely Champions they were not just about to hand over the first slot as they powered their way beyond the score to record a victory with 240 for 4. Excellent effort by LSL but still no cigars!

Last Saturday, for once, the weather determined the outcome, and playing against Over Stowey LSL scored 132 with captain Smudge Smith, top scoring on 46. However at 19 for 1 the heavy rain continued to fall making further cricket impossible and the game was tied with a further 12 points being picked up.

So at the end of July LSL are lying third in the league and promotion is possible with 5 more matches to play.

A big thank you to all the people who helped to organise the event and to all those who turned up to support the club on the 14<sup>th</sup> July. The weather was gorgeous and Jono the singing jukebox delivered some fantastic singing of well-known tunes to thoroughly entertain us whilst beer, cider, wine and G & T's were happily consumed, with delicious burgers, hotdogs and fresh salads. Although numbers were a little down from previous years, the evening was very well received and enjoyed and a few hundred pounds was earned to add to the kitty.

### Poppies For Remembrance



## Could you lend a hand to help restore Somerset's iconic fingerposts?

More volunteers and community groups are being urged to get involved with a ground-breaking project to restore historic signposts in Somerset. In response to stretched finances, the Somerset Fingerpost Restoration Project was set up by Somerset County Council and the Southwest Heritage Trust in 2016 to help preserve and protect the signs by harnessing the goodwill of volunteers and exploring alternative funding options.

Exmoor National Park Authority, with support from the Council and the Heritage Lottery Fund, has since run a hugely successful project in West Somerset with more than 100 volunteers recruited and more than 60 signs restored to date. More volunteers and community groups are now being sought to get involved to carry on work that the Council no longer has the money to fund.

Somerset County Council and the Southwest Heritage Trust have produced a handbook that provides all the information required to enable community groups to decide if they would like to take part in this valuable project. It also contains a fascinating potted history of fingerposts in Somerset.

- \* Sort and roughly segregate materials in boxes without using carrier bags.
- \* Rinse all containers and squash all but glass and aerosols.
- \* Cut up all large card and flatten all cardboard boxes.
