PARISH COUNCIL

Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland Parish Council Meeting

Minutes of the meeting held on 19th July 2021 at Lydeard st Lawrence Village Hall at 7.30pm.

Councillors in attendance: Deborah Telling (Vice Chair, acting Chair for this meeting), Cllrs Charles Cox, Don Hobson and Mark Peters

Also in attendance: Lorna Thorne, Parish Clerk, SWT Cllr Anthony Trollope-Bellew, and Christine Brewer, Village Agent for LsL.

Christine Brewer introduced herself to the Parish Councill and gave a brief report on her role in the Village.

SWT Cllr Anthony Trollope-Bellew gave his report. He informed the Council that the decision on the new unitary Council for Somerset was due this month.

He also informed the Council that the Waste Partnership Recycling team are having issues with a shortage of HGV drivers, and some recycling may not get picked up as a result. The next phase of improving recycling is coming to the village in September/October when residents will be able to place more recycling in their kerbside bins, this is expected to require fewer HGV drivers so should help with the driver shortages as well as improve recycling rates in the area.

21/37 Chapel Leigh Salt Bin

It was suggested that the steep sharp corner, near to Cob Castle in Chapel Leigh would benefit from having a salt bin rather than the use of salt bags.

Cllr Marshall has researched this online and once again the cheapest salt bin is from Peacock Salt. The price is still £134.95 including VAT and delivery. We shall also need some bags of salt; Peacocks price for a 25kg bag of rock salt is £10.15.

Cllrs agreed to purchasing the Salt Bin and 2 or 3 bags of salt, proposed by Cllr Peters and Seconded by Cllr Cox.

CHURCH NEWS

Church Development Project Update August 2021

Good news at the end of July. The Diocesan Advisory Committee has agreed that our formal faculty application can be advertised. All the consultation work, listening and acting on advice, adjustments and justifications that we have presented have been accepted in principle. The final step, following the standard advertising period, is for the Chancellor of the Bath and Wells Diocese to grant the faculty, probably in September. For churches, this is the equivalent of the planning permission process.

We have also received the drainage discharge licence from the Environment Agency that we need for the drainage system for the new facilities.

This stage of the project has been possible thanks to funding from the National Lottery Community Fund. It has paid for the work to get the drainage licence, the design and consultation work and the changes we have made with the dais make more space for activities at the front of the church.

Next we are planning to apply for a Heritage Lottery grant, to pay for the bulk of the work and to promote the use of the new facilities. As part of this we would like to engage again with the various community organisations that might use the new facilities. We would like to put together a programme of activities over the next couple of years to highlight the potential of the new facilities and to that link people with the building's rich heritage.

As a reminder, back in 2018 we had a list of possible activities that we used for the local opinion survey,

- Regular services, weddings baptisms and funerals.
- Entertainment music, other performances.
- Singing and music making courses.
- Bell ringing events, training courses.
- Social gatherings.
- School assemblies.
- School activities, gymnasium, dance, performance.
- Exhibitions of school work.
- Exhibitions of interest to visitors historical, artistic, local business etc.
- Quiet area for research, reading, training etc.
- Access to parish records, maps and other reference documents.

We can add to this list. Several other ideas came up in the survey and they are not forgotten! If you would like to get involved in this stage of the project, please contact one of the project team.
