CHURCH REPORTS AND NOTICES

'I want to be Joseph'

As you are probably aware, we are not hosting a Christmas Tree Festival this year but - we are offering a series of reflections on the Nativity characters called 'I want to be Joseph' Advent is a time of waiting and preparation, a time not only to buy presents, sort Christmas lunch and choose the best gin but to remind ourselves of the story that started it all - the story of the birth of Jesus.

Many of us remember doing the nativity play at school or in church, and the battles we had over the different characters we wanted to be. Some of us may have longed to have the part of Joseph, but never got beyond being an angel or a star! And that may be the last time you thought about the characters involved in the Christmas story.

The reflections we are presenting give the opportunity to refresh our memory on the Nativity and the different characters but also to think about what they might teach us today. Around the church will be different reflections. Where there are activities to do, then please take part and use the materials provided and take the various things away with you. Once you've completed the reflections, there will be an opportunity to fill in the comments book and there will also be contact details if you want to talk further with someone about anything you've encountered.

The stations will be positioned in various parts of the church from the afternoon of Saturday 15^{th} December until Saturday 12^{th} January. They will feature: Elizabeth (Mary's cousin); Mary; Joseph; and the shepherds. After Twelfth Night -6^{th} January - the station for Elizabeth and the shepherds will be dismantled and, in their place, there will be a station regarding King Herod; and the Wise Men - as these are believed to have visited at some point after the birth of Jesus.

Please make a note of this in your diary and come along to have a look and take part. This is something a bit different. So often we hear the story in a carol service or on Christmas Day, but perhaps there is so much more to discover if we sit with the characters for a while. We look forward to welcoming everyone.

EXCITING OPPORTUNITY 18th MAY 2019

If an item on your "bucket list", or one of your ambitions, is to experience abseiling, now's your chance.

Plans are afoot for a sponsored abseil down the tower of St Lawrence's Church on Saturday 18th May 2019, as part of our fundraising programme to make the church a more accessible building for all our community to use. The abseil will be in conjunction with the church at Cotford St Luke, where a new building has been constructed – but they have no tower. This is why our church tower has been examined and considered suitable for such an activity.

The day will be supervised by several qualified instructors who are also involved in organising the Wellington Carnival, and all relevant insurances will be in place to cover the event. Entrants will be harnessed at ground level and then steep steps up the tower will need to be negotiated while clipped to a rope. There is also a narrow entrance to get onto the roof.

Up to 60 participants can be accommodated; the community at Cotford St Luke already have between 10 and 20 interested potential abseilers. We need to find 30 volunteers – village residents, family members, friends etc. who should – ideally – be at least 13 years old with no upper age limit; this is to ensure that they "fill" the harness and so that the rope devices operate properly. This is a strict requirement for anyone wishing to take part.

There will be toilet facilities provided and refreshments available on the day. Family and friends are invited to come along to watch. A Certificate of Achievement will be awarded on completion.

PLEASE – put this date in your diary if you would like to attempt this and support your village church by obtaining sponsorship and having fun!

REFUSE ADVICE

No garden waste collections 24 December - 4 January; resuming 7 January. Revised days also apply to assisted and clinical waste collections.

Recycling sites follow usual schedules, except **all sites close at 4pm** on Monday 24 and 31 December. All sites closed 25-26 December and 1 January.

Christmas trees - either: home compost, or take to a recycling site or, if you have a garden waste subscription, undecorated trees under 6ft can go out for collection on your usual garden waste collection day from 7 January, or look for local charity shredding/collections.

(Last resort: send tree to costly, wasteful, polluting landfill. Place next to your rubbish bin on your usual collection day 7-18 January 2019).
