Also in attendance: Lorna Thorne, Parish Clerk, County Cllr Mike Rigby and 2 members of the public.

The meeting was preceded by a presentation by Neil Files of Inhouse Training and Consultancy, a company based in Ford near Wiveliscombe, about First Aid training courses they can offer. Cllrs will talk to villagers to see if there is interest and discuss this matter at the next meeting.

Cllrs all agreed to fully support the request for Football equipment.

The total amount of £719.85 has been paid from CIL, the equipment has now arrived and been checked by Simon Broad. Cllr Hele will liaise with Simon regarding the use of the equipment.

06.5 Cllrs agreed to raise an invoice to the Cricket Club for £5.00 for the rent of the playing field.

19/07 Somerset County Council Rights of Way Team: Parish Paths Consultation

Cllrs have reviewed the consultation and were disappointed to see that a lot of the footpaths in the Parish were classed as low value (3) to the community, meaning they are rarely used and therefore would not be on a vegetation cut schedule. Cllr Venner will respond to the Consultation requesting the paths are upgraded to at least moderate use, (2), as it was felt most of the footpaths are used regularly by walkers within the village and by visitors.

Cllr Venner will also request a response from residents within the Parish on how often they use the footpaths and which ones they use most. This will also coincide with his research into which footpaths need improving.

19/08 Letter to all Parishes in Somerset regarding the Somerset Wood

Cllrs agreed that the memorial wood was a fantastic idea but felt that money could be spent locally with the Villages' own memorial site. The item will be placed on the next Agenda and Cllrs would look into suitable sites and ideas.

19/08 Any other Business

Cllr Rigby spoke to the Council. He informed the Council of his reasoning to become a Liberal Democrat representative moving away from being Independent.

The Somerset Councils budgets will be set at the February meeting with further cuts expected as the Government is withdrawing all its funding.

Cllr Harding request that the Council consider funding some new Village Signs for Tolland, this will be added to the next Agenda.

Cllr Hobson reported some blocked drains and mud on roads, this will be reported to SCC to be cleared/cleaned.

Cllr Vickery requested that Pyleigh and Chapel Leigh have 'Not suitable for HGV's' signs added to the roads as a large lorry got stuck in the narrow lane, damaging the bank and a water pipe. This will be reported, but it was felt with no alternative access to the properties the signs would not be observed.

Cllr Hele has been approached by Ewan McKenzie, a year 9 student requesting some voluntary work for his Duke of Edinburgh award. He has to complete 13 hours, and Cllr Hele suggested he could help the Council with litter clearing, website maintenance, to attend meetings and other activities that the Council were undergoing. Cllrs agreed to Ewan being a volunteer and Cllr Hele would oversee his work.

Cllr Hele requested that the playing field could be used by a Boot Camp group, Cllr agreed this would be a great use of the space but the request would need to be put to the Cricket Club as they are responsible for the playing field.

A request has also been made by a dog trainer to use the playing field. This was not within the 'No Dog' rules of the playing field; Cllrs will ask around for an alternative space to assist the business.

The next meeting will be on Monday 4th March 2019 at 7.30pm

With no other business the meeting was closed at 8.45pm

You may have heard the peal of bells rung on Thursday 12 January and the Quarter peal of bells rung on Thursday 17 January and wondered what they were ringing for.

They were ringing to celebrate the life of Peter Willan, one time tower captain of Lydeard St Lawrence bells. Peter, along with many other local residents, was instrumental in completely refurbishing the bells and bell frame in the tower in 1980/1981. Before this was achieved, the 5 bells were on very old wooden equipment and extremely difficult to ring even for experienced and competent ringers.

All the old equipment and the bells were removed, and the bells sent off to be retuned, with a new bell sponsored by Peter added. The new metal bell frame was fitted and the bells rehung to make a very good ring of six. These were more recently augmented to make the lovely ring of eight bells we now have.

It is thanks to Peter and his team of supporters and helpers that we can enjoy easy bells to ring and listen to.

Church Abseiling Day Saturday 18th May 2019

As part of our ongoing fundraising efforts for the church of St Lawrence, we will be holding an abseiling event. Guided by an experienced team of commercially-insured abseilers this is a chance for anyone to try abseiling down the church's 75 foot high tower. Regardless of previous experience, everyone is welcome to come and give it a try.

The day will run from 9-5. Participants will be scheduled into a fifteen-minute timeslot on the day and will be provided with all necessary safety equipment. There will be toilet facilities and refreshments available. We are hoping to have stalls offering fresh produce, plants, cakes, etc.

Taking Part

We have 30 abseiling descent slots available which will be allocated beforehand on a first come, first served basis. The event is open to anyone over 13 and there is no upper age limit. Previous events have seen an 89-year-old take part, can we top that?

Those wishing to take part **MUST** register their intention with Revd. Maureen, who will then provide you with a sponsorship form. Once you have registered, if you wish to set up an online sponsorship page you could do so through sites such as My Donate or Just Giving.

The suggested minimum amount of sponsorship each abseiler should raise is £30, but sponsorship above this amount would be gratefully received. Perhaps you could get people to sponsor you per foot for the 75 foot trip down the tower. If the thought of descending from a tower fills you with dread, then you can still join in the fundraising effort by being sponsored **NOT** to take part in the event. If you are a taxpayer, Gift Aiding your sponsorship increases the amount of money raised.

Our fundraising efforts are geared towards reordering the church of St Lawrence to make it more user-friendly and accessible to everyone within the community. With the funds from events like this, we can apply for matching funding to help realise the church's plans. News from your Village Agent



By February many of us will have lost motivation for our good intentions of *Dry January* and *New Year diet and fitness plans* so here is a little bit of information to help you to keep up the good work.

A recent study conducted by University College of London shows 48% of Britons will be obese by 2045 if current trends are not halted. 1 in 4 adults and 1 in 5 children aged 10-11 years are obese which leads to Type 2 diabetes, coronary heart disease, stroke, bowel, pancreatic, kidney, liver and stomach cancer.

The New Year Diet and fitness TV shows explained the way that we can reduce our current serious health problems such as type 2 diabetes through diet and exercise. Drastic changes to diet and lifestyle can often be unsustainable so remember to manage change gently and try something different if at first you don't succeed. Evening gym and exercise classes may not fit your timetable, but you may be able to join your local health walk or go for a lunch time stroll and take the stairs when shopping. Tidy up that garden or volunteer to help with open spaces in your area. One day a week without the evening glass of wine is a positive start! Check your parish magazine or ask us for details of local activities and check with your GP if you have a health condition.

"It is a process to change your taste buds, and it might not feel good those first few days," "But over a week or so, your taste buds will adapt." After eating a diet with less sodium, identifying food as tasting too salty can happen pretty quickly, in a week or less. Ariana Cucuzza, a registered dietitian with the Cleveland Clinic's Centre for Functional Medicine 2018 Rally Health, Inc.

Keep going everyone!

A quick reminder to check the expiration date on **blue badges and bus passes** as they run out and can't be used. Bus passes are not being replaced unless you request it (to reduce wastage costs). Call 0300 123 2224 to get yours replaced.

We all know that the NHS is under great strain in the winter and it can be hard to get a Doctor's appointment. Consider whether you could get advice from your **local Pharmacy** where you will not need an appointment but there are private rooms to support advice and diagnosis.

Pharmacy teams can give advice about a range of common conditions and minor injuries such as aches and pains, sore throats, coughs, colds, flu, earache and skin rashes. They also provide the morning after pill and advice on pregnancy testing. They will advise on over the counter medicines as well. www.nhs.uk/live-well/healthy-body/how-your-pharmacist-can-help.
