Minutes of the Meeting held on 4th December at 7.30pm in Lydeard St Lawrence Village Hall.

Councillors present, Jonathan Marshall (Chairman), Deborah Telling (Vice Chair), Charles Cox, Mary Harding, Matt Hele, Don Hobson, Maeve Vickery and Edward White.

- 17/91 Declarations of interest None received
- 17/92 The **Minutes** of the meeting held on 16^{th} October were agreed as an accurate record.

17/93 Matters Arising

93.1 17/82 Dog fouling in the village

There seems to be an increase of dog fouling within the Village especially outside the Primary School. Cllr Marshall would put a message in the newsletter requesting responsible dog ownership and for people to pick up their dog mess. He also requested that perhaps the village could have a designated dog waste bin, rather than residents using the litter bin. It was suggested that Cllr Marshall should investigate this further.

To have a dog waste bin in the Village would cost £345 plus VAT. The bin could be emptied weekly at a cost of £5.25 per time and a total yearly cost of £273. This seems a lot of money to be spent and the Council agreed to monitor the situation in the village with the request for responsible dog ownership in the Newsletter. The playing field signs saying 'No dogs' have been lost and should be replaced.

93.2 17/84 Christmas Tree Festival 2017

The Parish Council have been asked if they would like a Christmas tree at this year's festival. Cllrs thought it was a great way for the Parish Council to support the community and Cllr Telling agreed to take charge of decorating the tree. A medium sized tree would be purchased.

Cllr Telling has put up the Tree in Church with some great thought in the decorations with handmade road signs to represent the Parish Council. Cllr Marshall thanked Cllr Telling for taking on the Christmas Tree and for her very inventive decorations which has been echoed through the Village.



93.3 89.3 The Parish Council were asked if the damaged cones by the school could be removed. Cllrs had no objections. These have now been removed.

93.4 17/83 Paint for fingerposts

Cllr Marshall requested the purchase of paint as required to refurbish the Parish fingerposts. Cllrs agreed and suggested a working party to be set up in the spring. It was also suggested that a few people go on the Course set up by SCC for the maintenance of Finger Posts. Cllr Marshall has now completed the course, however has found out that he is unable to restore any signs that are against the road and any he is able to do cannot be done alone. A request to residents to take the course will be made to enable the restoration of the signs.

- 95.7 Cllrs agreed to pay the Parish Council Grants to Lydeard St Lawrence Village Hall Committee for £500.00 Lydeard St Lawrence Cricket Club for £500.00
- 95.8 To Pay Clerks Salary and Expenses Cllrs agreed to pay £350 for salary and £8.89 for the Clerk's expenses. Proposed Cllr Cox Seconded Cllr Hobson The Parish Council reviewed the Clerk's Salary and have agreed to increase it with immediate effect to £1629 per year.
- The CIL Annual Report has been submitted to TDBC, payments received were £459.17 and payments 95.9 made to the Primary School Library of £750, leaving £1591.50 in the CIL fund.

17/96 **Tolland Phone Box Update** (17/80, (17/30))

Cllr Harding has gained a third quote for new Paving Slabs around phone box. The Quote was £460 from John Brand and is considerably cheaper than the previous guotes gained. Andy Coleman has also guoted £60 to place a concrete ramp up to the door, although cheaper this is not what the council required to stop the growth of surrounding vegetation. Cllrs voted to accept John Brand's quote to go ahead with the work (4 in favour, 2 against and 2 abstentions).

17/97 Village Defibrillator in Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland (17/81 (17/71))

The Parish Council agreed that a defibrillator in both Villages would be great but concerns over accessing them in an emergency were raised. Both Villages do not have good, reliable mobile phone signal and a landline would be difficult to access in an emergency.

The Parish Council has been awarded the two Grants of a £1000 for two defibrillators.

Although Cllr Vickery has researched the practicalities of having no phone signal and accessing them in an emergency she still needed to research more. Cllrs agreed more information was required for the next meeting.

17/98 Budget and Precept

- 98.1 The Clerk presented the Budget for 2018/19, with a healthy spending from the Community Benefit Fund and a healthy unrestricted fund. The footpath and play area funds are increasing. Cllr Telling suggested we look into how the footpath fund should be spent. This year has also seen some payments from the CBF to the Primary School and Cricket Club.
- Currently this year the Precept is £19.286 per Band D equivalent, so we received £4053. 92.2 If we want to keep it the same then we would ask for £4103 as the tax base is slightly higher this for 2018/19. (212.72 compared to 210.12 last year.) Cllrs agreed to setting the Precept to be the same as last year and ask for £4053. Pr Cllr Cox S Cllr Telling

Cllrs agreed that Lydeard Lifts were the local volunteer service and not to support Wivey Link financially.

17/100 Website Merger

WebMe, the Village website provider, are winding down their hosting operations so we need to find a new home for the Web pages. WebMe are suggesting we can achieve a seamless transfer if we move to a company called Heart Internet. WebMe is a Heart Internet reseller, so our hosting platform will be identical to our current set up. If we go to Heart Internet, Liz McConnell would recommend we go for a StarterPro option, the basic package. This would give us 5GB of Web space (we currently use somewhat less than 78 MB) and 30GB of monthly bandwidth. The cost of the StarterPro package is £31.87 a year but we will also need to pay a £10 set up fee and a £25 transfer fee in the first year making a total of £66.87 for the first year. Second and subsequent years will be just £31.87 or whatever that rises to in the future. Last time we paid for hosting, it was in the order of £60 plus £15 for the domain name. The Domain name is billed separately and is £15. The current registration for this expires in October 2019 so we won't be billed for this until then.

Cllrs agreed to Liz's suggestions and thanked her for her hard work and research in this matter.

17/101 White Space Broadband

Whitespace is the name given to gaps in the old TV wireless spectrum used before the big digital TV switchover. Whitespace UK is a company who can deliver broadband in these gaps over several kilometres, and the signal can travel over hills and challenging terrain, through buildings and trees. Following a desktop exercise, they are confident in being able to deliver a service to our community, providing consistent broadband speeds in the region of 16-20MBps.

Cllr White will progress to the next stage which will involve a site visit and more detailed proposal and bring to the next meeting, where he will have a greater understanding for service areas and costs. In the meantime, Cllr White would encourage members of the community that may be interested in signing up to the service to register their interest with him via email. (edward@willettfarm.co.uk) This way we can start to gather a picture of where to focus initial coverage zones. Website is https://www.whitespaceuk.com/

17/102 Any other Business

102.1 Cllr Hele has sent a letter to express an interest for the TDBC Capital Grant Scheme within the 2018/19 financial from the Parish Council and Cricket Club year to improve or replace the current play area equipment on the playing fields. Cllrs have asked the issue be placed on the next agenda to enable the Council to set a plan for the improvements and requirements of the current play area.

102.2 The post and rail fencing along Quickbeam Lane is rotten and collapsing, which has left the road edge unclear and hazardous. Cllr Marshall would report to the SCC.

102.3 Cllr Harding reported that Tolland Lane near the junction with Tarr Road had a large area of standing water across the lane. Further drainage would be better than a gully and Cllr Marshall would report this to SCC.

102.3 County Cllr Mike Rigby then spoke to the Parish Council. He spoke about some of the on-going issues in the area, including the Children's Centre Consultation and the possible loss of the Bishops Lydeard Centre; Children's Services in TD being inspected as inadequate; a Library Consultation for the new year, putting Bishops Lydeard Library at risk, "use it or lose it."; and the Staplegrove proposal for new housing development. Cllr Rigby informed the Council of the new speed limit of 30mph from Staplegrove to Norton Fitzwarren. He was asked about the current situation with broadband which he will follow up.

102.4 Cllr Marshall thanked the Council for all their services over the past year and wished everyone and Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, the next meeting being on Monday 15th January 2018 at 7.30pm. There being no further business, the meeting was closed at 9.20pm.

We're still not sure exactly how much has been raised, but it is thought to be in the region of $\pounds700$ which is more than double the amount raised at our first event in 2016. Thank you to all those who sponsored a tree and decorated it so beautifully. Many visitors were intrigued at the thought and trouble which had been taken in the decorations and the event was pronounced "posher" than our first event (not quite sure what that means!).

The **Annual Christingle** event was also very well attended. Nearly 30 Christingles were assembled by both adults and children in the village hall and then everyone processed to the church for a short service and to light the Christingles. We all sang about the Christingles by the light of the candles.

The **Carol Service** on 17th December saw fewer people attending than in 2016, which was a shame. However, we heard the Christmas story read by village residents and we had refreshments afterwards including hot drinks and mince pies. Cakes which were unsold at the Christmas Tree Festival had been safely stored, and were given away free after the service.

Thank you to all those who came along to our **Midnight Communion** on Christmas Eve - a service which it is thought has not happened for the last ten years.

He has also pointed out that all walkers, with or without dogs, should keep strictly to the Rights of Way shown on the Ordnance Survey map. Although there are public footpaths across some of Mr Gribble's fields, that does not make the whole field a right of way.
