Lydeard St Lawrence Cricket Report

Since I last reported on the season and having notched up our first win, I am very pleased to say that both the weather and our performances have been exceptional. Three wins and a defeat have catapulted the team to 3rd in the division and dare I mention it at this stage but even possible promotion. (I said that last bit in a whisper so don't repeat it!).

Even the Chairman turned out for the match against Stoodleigh and on a lovely day high on the countryside in Devon, I witnessed a superb batting display by Mark Hannaford in amassing 101 runs. He was superbly helped out by Pat Tomlinson on 65 not out and Ben Meek on 51 not out as the team put together an innings of 251 for 2. Stoodleigh threatened to chip away at the score but with great bowling by Louis Bennett and others we bowled them out for 199 and bagged all 26 points.

A week later and another 26 points with a clinical demolition of neighbours Crowcombe 1 who were all bowled out for a miserly 62 after LSL has scored 201. Recycling plastic packaging

All the Somerset recycling centres can now take various types of plastic packaging:

- Plastic pots for yoghurt, soup, face cream hair gel, and their lids
- Plastic tubs for margarine, spreadable butter, ice cream and laundry tablets
- Plastic trays (including black trays) for meat, ready meals &c.
- Plastic punnets for fruit and mushrooms
- Plastic tubs such as those used for dips, olives &c. (including lids)

All foil, film covers, absorbent pads and card should be removed, and the items rinsed. They should be placed in the skips used for plastic bottles.

However, please note that these items are **not** as yet accepted at the weekly kerbside recycling collections – they must be taken to the recycling centres.





Not sure who to turn to? Village Agents are a charity that work with individuals and social groups to give confidential support and advice. We can enable people to be more independent in their home, manage personal finances, care for family members and advise on just about anything!

My name is Gaby Bellamy and I am YOUR local Village Agent.

I am writing in beautiful sunshine and I do hope that this is set to continue. I remember this time last year when it was very hot and I learned that medication can get over heated too. Liquids especially, can lose their effectiveness if left in a very hot place.

So can humans! Don't forget to keep drinking water as dehydration is an easy thing to fall victim to. Sometimes it makes you feel groggy and "headachey" as your body needs water to complete its every day jobs such as thinking and digesting your meal. Left unattended, it can make you very ill.

Staying cool can be difficult when the temperatures soar. The NHS offers these tips for coping in hot weather:

- Shut windows and pull down the shades when it is hotter outside. You can open the windows for ventilation when it is cooler.
- Avoid the heat: stay out of the sun and don't go out between 11am and 3pm (the hottest part of the day) if you're vulnerable to the
 effects of heat.
- **Keep rooms cool** by using shades or reflective material outside the windows. If this isn't possible, use light-coloured curtains and keep them closed (metallic blinds and dark curtains can make the room hotter).
- Have cool baths or showers, and splash yourself with cool water.
- **Drink cold drinks regularly**, such as water and diluted fruit juice. Avoid excess alcohol, caffeine (tea, coffee and cola) or drinks high in sugar.
- Listen to alerts on the radio, TV and social media about keeping cool.
- Plan ahead to make sure you have enough supplies, such as food, water and any medications you need.
- Identify the coolest room in the house so you know where to go to keep cool.
- Wear loose, cool clothing, and a hat and sunglasses if you go outdoors.
- Check up on friends, relatives and neighbours who may be less able to look after themselves.

Seek help from a GP or contact the NHS by telephoning 111 if someone is feeling unwell and shows symptoms of:

- breathlessness
- chest pain
- confusion
- intense thirst

- weakness
- dizziness
- cramps which get worse or don't go away

Get the person somewhere cool to rest. Give them plenty of fluids to drink.
