#### CHURCH DEVELOPMENT GROUP June 2018

An order has been placed for repairs to the church path between the main gate and the war memorial. It is anticipated that the work will take about a week and it will be done during the school summer holidays. Access to the public footpath will be maintained either through the main gate or the side gate.

Experts from the Diocesan Advisory Committee visited the church on 10 May to look at the options for provision of toilets and a servery, changes to the seating, heating and access to the church. The church is an important asset to the community and we want to safeguard its future. The architect is now drawing up some plans reflecting the DAC advice. We will show the ideas to local people and visitors and discuss how the building could contribute more effectively to community activities. This will help us to make the case for fund raising and grants to provide the facilities that are needed.

We will have plans and drawings available at various events over the summer and autumn of this year and hope that you will take the time to comment on them.

### **Cricket Report**

The season has started and LSL have now posted their first win of the campaign, a quality display at the end of May against one of the better teams in the division, Over Stowey. On a hot and sultry day, LSL batted first and excellent knocks by Tom Meek (62) and James Anthony (54) eventually saw the home side amass a total of 199 runs for the loss of 8 wickets. A solid bowling performance from the bowlers then ensured that the visitors did not get near the total and were all out for 151, giving LSL the 26 points which has propelled them up the table to 7th Place.

The first match of the season was cancelled against Timberscombe at their Cowbridge ground, despite glorious weather, as the cold and wet spring meant that their ground had still not dried out, so points were shared. The next week was the first home match and we saw the visitors, Dulverton, in fine form and they made 195 for 8 in their 40 overs. Despite a great tea and some promising performances, wickets fell regularly and the home side were all out for 83, a disappointing start after earlier promise. The team then went to Bagborough to play on the 19th May and the home team proved to be too strong, putting on a grand total of 279 runs for 8. LSL replied with a gross total of 144 all out.

#### SHEEP WORRYING From our PCSO

Dog owners are required by law to keep their dogs on a lead when being walked across Open Access land. In all other areas of the countryside dogs should be kept under close control. It's not just the physical attacks that cause harm but simply allowing a dog to chase sheep may cause ewes to abort or become injured.

We have to remember that, no matter how unlikely it may seem to their owners, dogs have a natural instinct to chase and even in some cases hunt. Sheep lambs and wildlife can easily be disturbed if the dogs, no matter how well trained, and are not under very close control.

If your dog does kill or cause harm to livestock, you can be liable for a significant fine and for the value of the livestock harmed – your pet may also be dispatched, the cost of which will also have to be borne by you. Moreover, if your dog is actually seen in action harassing livestock, it could be shot on sight.

If you actually witness an attack in progress, call 999 otherwise any incidents witnessed should be reported to the Police on 101.

## Somerset County Council Time is running out to have your say

Anyone with an interest in Somerset's libraries has one more month to take part in the County Council's consultation on the future of its Library Service. The consultation ends on Wednesday 13 June and more than 4,000 responses have been received so far.

Somerset County Council is keen for anyone yet to complete the questionnaire to go online at <u>www.somerset.gov.uk/librariesconsultation</u> view the proposal on the future of the library they visit most often and give their feedback. Alternatively, complete the survey at your local library.

Decision makers want to know the impact potential changes to the library service would have on you, your family and communities. It also provides an opportunity to comment on the proposals and make alternative suggestions.

A final decision on Somerset's library service is expected later this year.

- The proposals show that for 12 libraries, there will be no change to the delivery of library services. These libraries include Minehead, Taunton and Williton.
- For 15 libraries, community support may be required to keep library buildings open. These include Bishops Lydeard, Nether Stowey, Priorswood (Taunton), Watchet and Wiveliscombe.

## **Somerset Mobile Library**

Please could I send my apologies to all our Somerset Mobile Library users. Unfortunately we have had a number of mechanical problems with our Mobile Library vehicle which has meant we have not been able to deliver our usual service across the County. We are working hard to resolve this issue and I am aware that for many of our customers it has been several weeks since you have received this service. Bad weather conditions with snow in February and March has also added to the difficulties.

We are committed to ensuring that we continue to support our customers so I wanted to suggest a couple of alternatives as an interim measure while we endeavour to get the vehicle back on the road.

 Somerset Home Library Service – currently delivered through the Royal Voluntary Service. This service is mainly delivered to customers who are housebound, however we do support a number of people who are unable to travel or access a local Library.
