- 20/40 Declarations of interest

20/41 The **Minutes** of the meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> June agreed as an accurate record and will be signed at the first face to face meeting of the Parish Council

Cllr Hobson declared a personal interest in items 6.5,6.6 & 10.1 on the Agenda Cllr Venner declared an interest in items 6.5 & 6.6 on the Agenda

20/43 Planning - Applications received for comment from Somerset West and Taunton Council: Planning applications have been sent to the planning committee for comment and displayed on the Parish Council's website

43.2 Councillors Training – Cllr Hobson attended a zoom training session provided by SALC on how to respond to planning applications. Cllr Hobson to write a report of key points he felt helpful from the training session.

### 20/44 Financial

44.7 Last year the Parish Council paid a grant to Tolland PCC for grass cutting at the church. It was agreed that this was a one-off payment. If Tolland PCC request further help with funding then the Parish Council will consider it in the normal manner.

All cheques will be posted to two Councillors and then returned to the Clerk for distribution.

### 20/45 One Somerset – Stronger Together - Consultations

Cllr Rigby gave a review of the situation with two bids currently being proposed - to create either a single Unitary Council in Somerset or create two smaller authorities East and West.

Bids are to be made by local authorities by Dec 2020, with a Government decision expected in Summer 2021; if the new unitary councils get approval it is expected that a shadow authority will be created to work for a year from spring 2022 with the new authority taking over from 2023.

Concerns have been expressed as to the size of a single unitary Council, and whether County Council elections will take place next Spring.

### 20/46 Tolland Church Gates

The refurbishment of Tolland Church gates continues and they have been shot blasted. Tolland PCC have gained funding for half the estimated quote and are hopeful that the works will keep within the quoted budget.



### 20/47 47.1 Play Area Equipment

SW&T have £2,500 of S106 monies to be used on new play equipment. A grant application request can be made for this money from the Village. The form has been passed onto the Playing Field Committee for consideration.

### 47.2 Dog Waste Bin

The refuse bin located at the Playing field continues to be filled with dog waste bags, this bin is then emptied by committee members. It has been requested that the Parish Council look into getting a suitable dog waste bin. Cllr Marshall agreed to look into costs for buying and regular emptying of a bin. It was suggested that maybe an alternative location within the village could be found away from the playing fields. It was also suggested that the Cricket Club could help finance a suitable bin, this request can be made once costings have been sourced.

### 20/48 48.1 Website updates from Liz McConnell

In June 2020 (NALC) sent the Parish Council a publication on website accessibility requirements outlining what we needed to do to ensure that our web pages were as accessible as possible for everyone. Liz agreed to take this on. She has now completed the review and made changes to the web pages so they are now compliant with the International WCAG (Web Content Accessibility Guidelines) 2.1 AA Standard as required.

An accessibility statement has been published on every web page (at the bottom). Liz has written a report which will be circulated to Cllrs with the minutes.

Cllr Marshall thanked Liz on behalf of the Parish Council for all her time and effort on completing the review. It was agreed that the Council should thank Liz with a gift. Cllrs agreed to sending Liz an Amazon voucher to the value of £50.

This was proposed by Cllr Telling and seconded by Cllr Venner and all agreed.

### 48.2 'Free' Trees

SW&T are offering free trees up to the value of £50 for local parishes to plant around their villages. Liz McConnell agree to complete the application on the Parish Councils behalf and if successful find suitable locations around the village to plant them. She has submitted a request for 3 oaks, 3 beech and 2 lime trees.

Please speak to Liz if you have any ideas where these trees could be planted.

### 20/52 Any other Business

Cllr Rigby gave a detailed report.

Natural England wrote to SWT expressing concerns about high levels of phosphates on the Levels and Moors, a Special Protection Area. It stressed the need to protect the area from further phosphate pollution. Phosphates can be found in fertilisers used in agriculture and in cleaned sewage released back into the waterways. Therefore, the SWT planning department will need to review its policies and all future planning applications will need to consider the safe deposal of phosphates and cleaning of runoff and sewage. This could take up to a year but hopefully by next Easter.

A car parking review is underway with two key areas, charging structures and placement of carparks.

SWT have approved the affordable employment land order that allows the development of land for employment projects up to 2,000 sq metres without planning approval.

Brexit lorry park - concerns have been made of the unknown detail from the government plans.

An Electric scooter trial has started in Taunton

Cllr Anthony Trollope-Bellew gave his report. He emphasised the report Cllr Rigby gave and added that the current situation on the Covid-19 pandemic was under constant review and the Gold Command on SWT has been reinstated where weekly meetings take place to review the ongoing situation.

West Somerset has the highest rate in the county but is still well below the national figures. Concerns on the age range in West Somerset with the highest number of over 65's in the country, people should continue to follow the guidelines and help suppress the virus.

Cllr Trollope-Bellew referred the Council to the White paper on Planning and that all should comment on the consultation.

Cllr Telling reported that the road along Quickbeam Lane has overgrown/overhanging hedges. Cllr Marshall has requested that Highways contact the appropriate landowners to ask that these and other roadside hedges in the Hoccombe/Chapel Leigh/Pyleigh area be cut back, as this is no longer Highways' responsibility in nearly all cases.

With no other business the meeting was closed at 8.20pm

The Proposed date of the next meeting is on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> November subject to Covid-19 guidelines.

### **Church Development Project Update October 2020**

Our plans for this year were put on hold with the challenge of coronavirus, the project team is now putting things back on track.

The paperwork for the faculty application has been updated and our architect is pursuing the permissions and formal agreements that we need from the statutory bodies.

We have asked the archdeacon for permission to start some of the work in advance of formal permission, some things like temporarily moving one row of the pews at the front of the nave, in a way that could be reinstated if required.

Our revised programme shows work on the pews during the winter and a contract to connect the water supply and drainage next spring.

Other work is also not forgotten, repairing and re-fixing the weathervane and the flagpole, improving the heating, the ongoing maintenance of the roof and work on the trees in the churchyard. Plenty to do!
