## PARISH COUNCIL

### Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland Parish Council Meeting

Minutes of the meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> October 2023 at Lydeard St Lawrence Village Hall at 7.30pm.

Councillors in attendance: Cllrs Jonathan Marshall, (Chairman) Deborah Telling, (Vice-Chair), Charles Cox, Don Hobson, Mary Harding, Guy Sturgess and Maeve Vickery

Also in attendance Lorna Thorne, Parish Clerk, David Oxley and 4 members of public.

One comment was raised by the members of the Public.

They were concerned the Parish Council did not take up the offer of making an Expression of Interest in Somerset Council's initiative of Community Funded 20mph Zones, especially as the village has a primary school that is currently in a national speed limit zone, which is rare. The Chairman explained the reasoning behind the Parish Council's decision not to proceed with an Expression of Interest and emphasised that this was not a permanent decision and it was a topic which will almost certainly be revisited in the future. It was agreed that ClIrs would look into having some speed check surveys done in the village, especially around the school road. It was also acknowledged the wording of minutes can be misconstrued and that more details should have perhaps been in them over the discussions had.

County Councillors Report, a monthly newsletter update has been circulated.

- 23.066. **Declarations of interest** Cllr Hobson declared a personal interest in items 11.2 &11.3 on the Agenda.

Cllr Harding and Mr Oxley declared an interest in item 7 on the Agenda.

23.067. The **Minutes** of the meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> September 2023 were agreed and signed as an accurate record.

#### 23.068. Matters Arising –

AOB The school Bus has reported a low hanging tree branch near Forge House. Cllr Telling informed the Council that the branch is due to be dealt with in the next few weeks.

#### 23.069. Casual Vacancy – Co-option of New Councillor

Cllr Harding requested that David Oxley be co-opted on to the Parish Council and that he represents the Tolland Ward. Cllrs agreed to co-opt Cllr Jonathan Marshall onto the Lydeard St Lawrence Ward and fill Cllr Weirs post and leave the Tolland Ward position vacant for David Oxley to then be co-opted on to the Parish Council.

Cllr Telling proposed that Cllr Marshall represent LSL Ward, this was seconded by Cllr Cox. Agreed by all.

Cllr Marshall then proposed that David Oxley be Co-Opted on to the Parish Council as the Tolland Ward Cllr, this was seconded by Cllr Cox and agreed by all. David Oxley then signed his declaration form.

23.070. **Planning - Applications received for comment from Somerset Council:** *Planning applications have been sent to Councillors for comment.* None received.

#### 23.071. Tolland Book exchange broken glass

Cllr Harding reported that one of the panes of glass on the book exchange is broken, it was suggested that it be replaced with Perspex rather that glass to avoid the issue happening again.

Cllr Oxley reported that he has replaced the broken glass with Perspex as suggested and requested he be reimbursed £13.49 for materials used. Cllrs agreed that this would be added to the next Agenda and thanked Cllr Oxley for his swift repair of the broken glass.

#### 23.073. Funding Request for Defibrillator Box for outside of Primary School

A Request to financially support the Primary school in placing an outside heated lockable box for their newly donated Defibrillator, so it can be used by the community outside of school hours, and accessible 24/7 has been made.

Cllrs supported the school on this but asked for more detail and for the school to gain 3 quotes and research for suitable boxes to get the correct box for the village.

- Please ensure you leave the gate closed behind you.
- Keep the tunnel that goes into the centre of the bonfire clear, this is very important.
- **ONLY** put burnable wood and brash on the bonfire, no rubbish, plastics, mattresses, tins of paint, metal gates, tyres etc. This is even more important than the previous point.

And on the night please, if at all possible, walk to the playing fields rather than driving, there is very limited parking. For those that do come by car, there will be signposts to the field we are using. Please follow these.

The October meeting was held in the village hall. After the meeting, we welcomed Mary Harding, one of our members, to give a talk on Heads and Tails.

This was an intriguing title and we were all pleasantly surprised when she revealed what the talk was actually going to be about.

She started with tails and showed us photographs of men displaying their "codpieces". The fashion at that time was to have the most ornate and largest one. The idea was that the men could keep money, papers and hankies in them. The fashion seemed to last for years and it fell out of use by the 1590s but in recent times it has been rediscovered with Michael Jackson having a photograph taken with one. It certainly gave us ladies a laugh.

Then Mary moved onto Heads. The first subject she talked about was the "ruff" which people like Elizabeth 1 wore. The more ornate and fancier they were, meant that you had money. They were very difficult to make and also to wash and re-starch to keep their shape. The fashion died out by the end of the 16th Century, but some later photographs showed that fashion models of today were wearing a very similar design. Wigs were also mentioned and Lucy Worsley wrote an article explaining all the names that were attributed to various wigs. This part of the talk covered both men's and women's wigs.

Mary was warmly thanked for her unusual talk and we look forward to another talk she might give in the future! Our November meeting will be A Spooktacular Surprise!
