Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland Parish Council Meeting

Minutes of the meeting held on 19th July 2021 at Lydeard st Lawrence Village Hall at 7.30pm.

Councillors in attendance: Cllrs Jonathan Marshall (Chairman), Deborah Telling (Vice Chair), Cllrs Charles Cox, Don Hobson, Maeve Vickery and Mark Peters.

Also in attendance: Lorna Thorne, Parish Clerk.

There were no Questions from members of the Public or reports received from County and District Councillors.

- 21/54 **Apologies** were received from Cllrs Andrew Venner, Tony Weir and SWT Cllr Anthony Trollope-Bellew
- 21/55 Declarations of interest None received.
- 21/56 The **Minutes** of the meeting held on 19th July 2021 were agreed and signed as an accurate record.

21/57 Matters Arising

21/37 Chapel Leigh Salt Bin

It was suggested that the steep sharp corner, near to Cob Castle in Chapel Leigh would benefit from having a salt bin rather than the use of salt bags.

Cllr Marshall wants to check the condition of the damaged Salt Bin in Tolland before purchasing the new bin, as it may be that two are required and it will save on postage costs. Cllr Marshall to look at bin as see if it can be repaired and also see if unrepairable damage is covered under the Councils insurance, and what the excess might be.

21/48 Book Exchange in Tolland – Repainting

Cllr Harding has requested that the Book Exchange in Tolland have a repaint, Cllr Harding has also requested 10 quotations but is yet to receive any, this will be placed on the next Agenda where hopefully we will have more information.

Cllr Harding gained a quote from painter Simon Bailey, who was able to complete the job for £350, but could only do this during August. An email was sent to all Cllrs who agreed this was a good quote and as it was less than £500 that the work could be completed during August, as set out in the Standing Orders. The work has now been completed to a high standard, and Cllrs thanked both Simon and Cllr Harding for their work on this.

On 9th September members of Lydeard St Lawrence W.I. gathered in the village hall for their first meeting "at home" for many months. Though fantastic outdoor meetings were enjoyed earlier in the year, a 100th Birthday Garden Party and an outing to The Newt in Somerset, it was good to be back.

The speaker for the evening was Jan Boddington of Blue Shed Flowers. Having told us how she became first an interested amateur and now a full-time grower and florist, she then gave a demonstration of a simple and beautiful arrangement, making use of her artistic background in her choice of colours and shapes. Jan works sustainably and organically, using wires instead of Oasis (which is plastic) and growing without pesticides - even though her blooms are occasionally "bio-diverse" with a stray bug hiding somewhere! Her floral designs change with the seasons, according to what she can pick herself or get from other local growers.

Our W.I. business was quickly attended to, with news and notices of forthcoming events. Tea and much chat followed.
