PARISH COUNCIL

Lydeard St Lawrence and Tolland Parish Council Meeting

Minutes of the meeting held on 11th September 2023 at Lydeard St Lawrence Village Hall at 7.30pm.

Councillors in attendance: Cllrs Jonathan Marshall, (Chairman) Deborah Telling, (Vice-Chair), Charles Cox, Don Hobson, Mary Harding, Mark Peters, Guy Sturgess and Maeve Vickery

Also in attendance Lorna Thorne, Parish Clerk, Faye Cross Liaison Officer from Airband and County Cllr Mike Rigby.

No Questions or Comments from members of the Public

County Councillors Report, a monthly newsletter update has been circulated.

Cllr Rigby understood the frustrations of taxpayers in them 'paying more, getting less', as they are looking at setting next year's budget, but are finding that most funding is going towards adult social care and children's services in the county, with no set limit to resources required; this is a national issue, and some Councils are in a worse situation than Somerset. It is likely some will go into administration, in these cases central government will ask for all non-essential items to be dropped, and the focus be on essential running of the Council. Councils are unable to increase their budgets at the same rate as increases to expenses and inflation.

Cllrs thanked Cllr Rigby for attending the meeting.

- 23.053. Faye Cross gave an update on the current (*Airband*) project in the area and is hopeful that the project can be completed by the end of October, even with some issues after a road closure was unable to be implemented. Anyone who has not already done so and would like to receive the new fast broadband should register their interest, installation is free and a monthly charge from £20/month up to £40/month.

23.057. Matters Arising -

(23.046) Planning – The possible planning breach at Hurley View has been rectified, the installation of obscured glass has been completed correctly to comply with the planning conditions.

(23.052) AOB – Hedge Cutting, this still has not been carried out in all areas of the Parish, Cllr Telling has reported it, and will do so again.

The *Potholes* that were reported on Lydeard Down Hill have been filled in.

23.059. Tolland Book exchange broken glass

Cllr Harding reported that one of the panes of glass on the book exchange is broken, it was suggested that it be replaced with Perspex rather that glass to avoid the issue happening again. Cllr Harding to ask the Tolland Community Group (TCG) if they have anyone able to replace the glass.

Cllr Rigby intends to attend the next LCN meeting and are looking at echoing the pattern to Exmoor area has taken. Cllr Telling and Marshall to also attend.

Cllr Marshall has a candidate in mind but would like to ask them first before sharing their details, Cllr Harding to also ask TCG as Tolland could be represented if Cllr Marshall be a LSL Cllr.

Our September meeting was held in the village hall. After the agenda we welcomed Alison Baker who did a talk on Somerset Mindline. She has been a volunteer for many years and said that they are busier since Covid and the lockdown. All ages were really affected by it all and it was noticed that more women were ringing the Mindline helpline than men. She said that men find it difficult to express their feelings and it is only now with the media highlighting the feelings of men that things are changing.

For both men and women there have been quite a few coffee mornings where people can meet up and have a chat. The Young Farmers is an organisation which has helped the farming community. This profession has the highest suicide rate due to their working on their own for most of the day.

There is a 24 hour mental health helpline and Alison volunteers two or three times a week. Even now she finds it heart wrenching when somebody phones and are on the point of harming themselves.

The talk was very thought provoking and it was generally felt that this organisation was being of great benefit to the people of Somerset. She was thanked for her talk.

The next month's speaker is one of our members who will be doing a "surprise" talk.

Unacceptable



New books of all types are received every week at Bishops Lydeard Library – see the displays.

Feature - Thermal Imaging Camera Loan Scheme

After last year's successful pilot scheme in South Somerset Libraries, the Thermal Imaging Camera Loaning Scheme is launching across all Somerset Libraries (including Community Libraries). The scheme enables customers to borrow an easy-to-use camera unit that connects directly to your smartphone or tablet (Android or Apple) and will provide you with a thermal image of your home or building. The image can then be used to interrogate and identify potential improvements, such as requirements for insulation and draught proofing within your home to improve your energy efficiency, as well as to reduce heat loss and fuel bills.

The cameras will be available soon to request for free from any Somerset library by a Somerset library user (with full adult membership) and can be borrowed for up to 3 days (renewals are not permitted).

What is heat loss and why does it matter?

Undertaking a thermal imaging heat loss self-survey could help provide you with the answers as to why your home might be cold highlighting areas where it is wasting your energy and money!

You may have noticed that parts of your home feel cold, or you may be planning specific refurbishments which the thermal imaging camera could help you with prioritising what to improve, and where.

What is a thermal image?

A thermal image is a digital representation of the thermal (heat) radiation emitted by the pictured objects. The thermal image allows us to identify the temperature of an object or at least its temperature relative to its environment. It can show if heat is passing through walls, window frames, doors, roofs etc.

Things to do

There is a trail of pictures for children to find, with a little prize for finding them all. There are also activities for children – colouring, lego, duplo and jigsaws.

Copies of local newspapers, magazines and leaflets are in the library to read. It is also a good location to find out about other village activities.
